You may visit any of these churches on Facebook to receive updated help or volunteer information.

- Take pictures of all damage, especially anything touched by flood water. Take pictures of your belongings before putting out to the curb
- Keep receipts, no matter how small
- Use local reputable contractors, never pay upfront or what is reasonable to start your repairs
- Check contractor referrals and make sure they are licensed and insured

Helpful Tips from others impacted by flood:

- Prepare to have patience with FEMA, SBA, and insurance.
- Document and run copies of all correspondence.
- Fill out the FEMA form ASAP
- If you are approved by FEMA to stay in a hotel, always put a credit card down for 2 weeks past the date that FEMA approved
- When filling out the forms for the different agencies there is a question that asks, "Are you staying at the damaged property?" If your property is damaged and you are unable to live there answer "NO". Once you indicate that you are able to live in the home, FEMA will think your home is suitable for long term
- Sign up with the Red Cross
